

LET MY PRAYER RISE BEFORE YOU




PRAYER

PASSION READING

Part 2 | Mark 14:27-42

²⁷Jesus said to them, "You will all fall away because of me. For it is written: 'I will strike the shepherd, and the sheep will be scattered.' ²⁸But after I am raised, I will go ahead of you into Galilee."

²⁹But Peter said to him, "Even if all fall away, I will not."

³⁰Jesus said to him, "Amen I tell you: Today—this very night—before the rooster crows twice, you will deny me three times."

³¹But Peter kept saying emphatically, "Even if I have to die with you, I will never deny you." And they all said the same thing.

³²They went to a place named Gethsemane. Jesus told his disciples, "Sit here while I pray." ³³Then he took Peter, James, and John along with him and began to be troubled and distressed. ³⁴He said to them, "My soul is overwhelmed with sorrow, even to the point of death. Stay here and keep watch."

³⁵Going forward a little, he fell on the ground and prayed that, if it were possible, the hour might pass from him. ³⁶He also said, "Abba, Father, everything is possible for you. Take this cup away from me. Yet not what I will, but what you will."

³⁷When he returned to the disciples, he found them sleeping. He said to Peter, "Simon, are you sleeping? Were you not strong enough to keep watch for one hour? ³⁸Watch and pray that you may not enter into temptation. The spirit is willing, but the flesh is weak."

³⁹Again he went away and prayed, saying the same thing. ⁴⁰When he returned, he found them sleeping, for their eyes were heavy. They did not know what they should answer him. ⁴¹He returned the third time and said to them, "Are you going to continue sleeping and

resting? It is enough. The hour has come. Look, the Son of Man is betrayed into the hands of sinners. ⁴²Rise, let us go. Look, my betrayer is near."

All we like sheep have gone astray, and the Lord has laid on him the iniquity of us all. By his wounds we are healed.


HYMN




