# Reading

Isaiah 52:13-53:12

<sup>13</sup>Look, my servant will succeed.
He will rise. He will be lifted up. He will be highly exalted.
<sup>14</sup>Just as many were appalled at him—
his appearance was so disfigured that he did not look like a man, and his form was disfigured more than any other person—
<sup>15</sup>so he will sprinkle many nations, and kings will shut their mouths because of him, because they will see something they had never been told before, and they will understand something they had never heard before.

**53** Who has believed our report, and to whom has the arm of the LORD been revealed?

<sup>2</sup>He grew up before him like a tender shoot and like a root from dry ground.
He had no attractiveness and no majesty.
When we saw him, nothing about his appearance made us desire him.

<sup>3</sup>He was despised and rejected by men,
a man who knew grief,
who was well acquainted with suffering.
Like someone whom people cannot bear to look at,
he was despised,
and we thought nothing of him.

<sup>4</sup>Surely he was taking up our weaknesses, and he was carrying our sufferings.
We thought it was because of God
that he was stricken, smitten, and afflicted,
<sup>5</sup>but it was because of our rebellion that he was pierced.
He was crushed for the guilt our sins deserved.
The punishment that brought us peace was upon him, and by his wounds we are healed.

<sup>6</sup>We all have gone astray like sheep. Each of us has turned to his own way, but the LORD has charged all our guilt to him.

<sup>7</sup>He was oppressed, and he was afflicted, yet he did not open his mouth.

Like a lamb he was led to the slaughter, and like a sheep that is silent in front of its shearers, he did not open his mouth.

<sup>8</sup>He was taken away without a fair trial and without justice, and of his generation, who even cared?

So, he was cut off from the land of the living.

He was struck because of the rebellion of my people.

<sup>9</sup>They would have assigned him a grave with the wicked, but he was given a grave with the rich in his death, because he had done no violence, and no deceit was in his mouth.

<sup>10</sup>Yet it was the LORD's will to crush him and to allow him to suffer.

Because you made his life a guilt offering, he will see offspring. He will prolong his days, and the LORD's gracious plan will succeed in his hand.

11 After his soul experiences anguish, he will see the light of life. He will provide satisfaction.

Through their knowledge of him, my just servant will justify the many, for he himself carried their guilt.

12 Therefore I will give him an allotment among the great, and with the strong he will share plunder, because he poured out his life to death, and he let himself be counted with rebellious sinners.

He himself carried the sin of many, and he intercedes for the rebels.



Dogs surround me, a pack of villains encircles me;


They pierce my hands and my feet.


They divide my garments among them and cast lots for my clothing.

<sup>38</sup>There was a written notice above him, which read: this is the king of the jews.

<sup>39</sup>One of the criminals who hung there hurled insults at him: "Aren't you the Messiah? Save yourself and us!"

<sup>40</sup>But the other criminal rebuked him. "Don't you fear God," he said, "since you are under the same sentence? <sup>41</sup>We are punished justly, for we are getting what our deeds deserve. But this man has done nothing wrong."

<sup>42</sup>Then he said, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom."

### The Death of Jesus

<sup>45</sup>From noon until three in the afternoon darkness came over all the land.

<sup>46</sup>About three in the afternoon Jesus cried out in a loud voice, "Eli, Eli, lemasabachthani?" (which means "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?").

My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?

Why are you so far from saving me, so far from my cries of anguish?

My God, I cry out by day but you do not answer, **by night, but I find no rest.** 

"In that day," declares the Sovereign Lord, "I will make the sun go down at noon and darken the earth in broad daylight."

Lord Jesus, you endured the horrific penalty of our sins as your Father turned his face from you on the cross. Compel us to see in your sacrifice the dreadful nature of sin and call us to acknowledge the amazing depth of your love. Overcome our shame, dear Savior, and give us grateful faith.

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Fifth Word John 19:28, 29

<sup>28</sup>After this, when he knew that all things necessary for the Scripture to be fulfilled had now been accomplished, Jesus said, "I am thirsty." <sup>29</sup>A jar of wine vinegar was there, so they soaked a sponge in it, put the sponge on a stalk of the hyssop plant, and lifted it to Jesus' lips.

My mouth is dried up like a potsherd, and my tongue sticks to the roof of my mouth; you lay me in the dust of death.

I am worn out calling for help; my throat is parched.

They put gall in my food and gave me vinegar for my thirst.

Dear Jesus, as our brother on earth you endured the agony of pain that besieged your body when your sacrifice was complete. Knowing our experiences, hover over us with your care and compassion when our bodies and hearts are hurting. Provide us with strength that we may confess you with confidence and power.

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Sixth Word John 19:30

<sup>30</sup>When he had received the drink, Jesus said, "It is finished." With that, he bowed his head and gave up his spirit.

On that day a fountain will be opened to the house of David and the inhabitants of Jerusalem,

to cleanse them from sin and impurity.

Because of the blood of my covenant with you,

### The Death of Jesus

<sup>44</sup>It was now about noon, and darkness came over the whole land until three in the afternoon, <sup>45</sup>for the sun stopped shining. And the curtain of the temple was torn in two. <sup>46</sup>Jesus called out with a loud voice, "Father, into your hands I commit my spirit." When he had said this, he breathed his last.

Into your hands I commit my spirit; deliver me, Lord, my faithful God.

He has not despised or scorned the suffering of the afflicted one; he has not hidden his face from him but has listened to his cry for help.

He poured out his life unto death, and was numbered with the transgressors. He bore the sin of many, and made intercession for the transgressors.

Loving Savior, at the moment of your death you gave yourself into the loving hands of your Father. As we close our eyes in death, lead us to commit our bodies and souls to him who has summoned us by name and made us his own because of you and your love. Then, we pray, let us depart in peace.

st. 7

7 My death will be triumphant no matter how I die;
Lord Jesus, in that instant escort my soul on high into my Father's keeping, all-blameless and all-blest, like waking up from sleeping, his hands my place of rest.

Reading John 19:31–42

<sup>31</sup>Now it was the day of Preparation, and the next day was to be a special Sabbath. Because the Jewish leaders did not want the bodies left on the crosses during the Sabbath, they asked Pilate to have the legs broken and the bodies taken down. <sup>32</sup>The soldiers therefore came and broke the legs of the first man who had been crucified with Jesus, and then those of the other. <sup>33</sup>But when they came to Jesus and found that he was already dead, they did not break his legs. <sup>34</sup>Instead, one of the soldiers pierced Jesus' side with a spear, bringing a sudden flow of blood and water. <sup>35</sup>The man who saw it has given testimony, and his testimony is true. He knows that he tells the truth, and he testifies so that you also may believe. <sup>36</sup>These things happened so that the scripture would be fulfilled: "Not one of his bones will be broken," <sup>37</sup>and, as another scripture says, "They will look on the one they have pierced."

### The Burial of Jesus


<sup>38</sup>Later, Joseph of Arimathea asked Pilate for the body of Jesus. Now Joseph was a disciple of Jesus, but secretly because he feared the Jewish leaders. With Pilate's permission, he came and took the body away. <sup>39</sup>He was accompanied by Nicodemus, the man who earlier had visited Jesus at night. Nicodemus brought a mixture of myrrh and aloes, about seventy-five pounds. <sup>40</sup>Taking Jesus' body, the two of them wrapped it, with the spices, in strips of linen. This was in accordance with Jewish burial customs. <sup>41</sup>At the place where Jesus was crucified, there was a garden, and in the garden a new tomb, in


which no one had ever been laid. <sup>42</sup>Because it was the Jewish day of Preparation and since the tomb was nearby, they laid Jesus there.
