THEME OF THE DAY: A DAY OF TERROR FOR ALL THOSE WHO TROUBLED GOD'S PEOPLE

Our world is full of victims of abuse, violence, and oppression. In many cases, this evil goes unnoticed or unpunished. Injustice can drive victims in two possible directions. They can be filled with despair over the unfairness of the situation. Or they can be filled with hatred and a desire for revenge. While Christians wait for Christ's return on the Last Day, they are by no means the only ones who suffer at the hands of others. They are, however, often included among them. 2 Thessalonians 1:5–10


God promises that on the Last Day all those who troubled his holy people will themselves be eternally troubled.

⁵ This is evidence of God's righteous verdict that resulted in your being counted worthy of God's kingdom, for which you also suffer. ⁶ Certainly, it is right for God to repay trouble to those who trouble you, ⁷ and to give relief to you, who are troubled along with us. When the Lord Jesus is revealed from heaven with his powerful angels, ⁸ he will exercise vengeance in flaming fire on those who do not know God and on those who do not obey the gospel of our Lord Jesus. ⁹ Such people will receive a just penalty: eternal destruction away from the presence of the Lord and from his glorious strength, ¹⁰ on that day when he comes to be glorified among his saints, and to be marveled at among all those who have believed, because our testimony to you was believed.

The Destruction of the Temple and Signs of the End Times

⁵ As some were talking about the temple, how it was decorated with beautiful stones and offerings, Jesus said, ⁶ "These things that you see here—the days will come when there will not be one stone left on another—every one will be thrown down."

⁷ They asked him, "Teacher, when will these things happen? And what is the sign that these things are about to happen?"

⁸ He said, "Watch out so that you are not deceived! For many will come in my name, saying, 'I am he,' and 'The time is near.' Do not follow them. ⁹ Whenever you hear of wars and revolutions, do not be terrified, for these things must happen first, but the end will not be right then."

¹⁰ Then he said to them, "Nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom. ¹¹ There will be great earthquakes, famines, and plagues in various places. There will be horrifying sights and great signs from heaven. ¹² But before all these things, they will lay their hands on you and will persecute you, handing you over to synagogues and prisons, bringing you before kings and governors for my name's sake. ¹³ It will turn out to be your opportunity to testify. ¹⁴ So make up your minds not to prepare beforehand how to defend yourselves, ¹⁵ for I will give you words and

wisdom that none of your adversaries will be able to withstand or contradict. ¹⁶ You will be betrayed even by parents, brothers, relatives, and friends. They will put some of you to death. ¹⁷ You will be hated by all people for my name's sake. ¹⁸ But not a hair of your head will perish. ¹⁹ By patient endurance you will gain your lives.



Lord's Prayer


