First Reading Jonah 3:1-10

Jonah reluctantly obeyed the Lord in going to preach to the city of Nineveh, and God greatly blessed his work.

- ¹ Then the word of the Lord came to Jonah a second time: ² "Get up. Go to Nineveh, the great city, and preach to it the message that I tell you."
- ³ So Jonah set out and went to Nineveh just as the word of the Lord had commanded. Now Nineveh was a great city to God. It required a three-day walk. ⁴ Jonah walked through the city for a day, and he called out, "Forty more days and Nineveh is going to be overthrown!"
- ⁵ The men of Nineveh believed God. They proclaimed a fast and put on sackcloth, from the greatest of them to the least. ⁶ When word reached the king of Nineveh, he got up from his throne, took off his royal robe, covered himself with sackcloth, and sat in ashes. ⁷ Then he issued a proclamation in Nineveh.

By the decree of the king and his leading officials:

Do not let people or animals, herds or flocks, taste anything. Do not let them eat food or drink water. ⁸ Instead, let people and animals be covered with sackcloth. Let everyone call fervently to God. Let them turn from their evil way and from the violence that is in their hands. ⁹ Who knows? God may turn and relent. He may turn from his burning anger so that we will not perish. ¹⁰ When God saw their actions, that they had turned from their evil way, God relented from the disaster which he said he would bring on them, and he did not carry it out.

Second Reading

Romans 10:8-15

Paul states that those who call on the name of the Lord will be saved. And the only way for someone to call on His name, is for someone to bring them the Gospel message..

⁸ But what does it say? "The word is near you, in your mouth and in your heart," that is, the word of faith that we are proclaiming. ⁹ Certainly, if you confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. ¹⁰ For it is with the heart a person believes, resulting in righteousness, and it is with the mouth that a person confesses, resulting in salvation. ¹¹ For Scripture says, "Everyone who believes in him will not be put to shame."


¹² So there is no distinction between Jew and Greek, because the same Lord is Lord of all, who gives generously to all who call on him. ¹³ Yes, "Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved."

¹⁴ So then, how can they call on the one they have not believed in? And how can they believe in the one about whom they have not heard? And how can they hear without a preacher? ¹⁵ And how can they preach unless they are sent? Just as it is written, "How beautiful are the feet of those who preach the good news of peace, who preach the gospel of good things!"

Gospel Mark 5:1-20

Jesus is confronted by a man who was possessed by many demons, and it is Jesus' voice alone that conquers this evil influence.

¹ They went to the other side of the sea, into the region of the Gerasenes. ² As soon as Jesus stepped out of the boat, a man with an unclean spirit came out of the tombs to meet him. ³ The

man lived in the tombs. Nobody could bind him anymore, not even with a chain. ⁴ For he had often been bound with shackles and chains, but he pulled the chains apart and broke the shackles in pieces. Nobody had the strength to subdue him. ⁵ Night and day, in the tombs and in the mountains, he was constantly crying out and cutting himself with stones. ⁶ When he saw Jesus from a distance, he ran and bowed down in front of him. ⁷ He cried out with a loud voice, "What do I have to do with you, Jesus, Son of the Most High God? I beg you to swear by God not to torment me." ⁸ For Jesus had said to him, "Come out of the man, you unclean spirit!"

"My name is Legion," he replied, "because we are many." ¹⁰ He begged Jesus repeatedly that he would not send them out of the region.

¹¹ There was a large herd of pigs there feeding on the hillside. ¹² The demons begged him, "Send us to the pigs so we may enter them."

¹³ Jesus gave them permission. The unclean spirits went out and entered the pigs. Then the herd of about two thousand pigs rushed down the steep bank into the sea and drowned. ¹⁴ Those who were feeding the pigs ran and reported this in the city and the countryside.

People came to see what had happened. ¹⁵ When they came to Jesus, they saw the man who had been possessed by the legion of demons sitting there clothed and in his right mind, and they were afraid. ¹⁶ Those who had seen it described for these people what had happened to the demon-possessed man, and they told them about the pigs. ¹⁷ They began to plead with Jesus to leave their region.

¹⁸ As Jesus was getting into the boat, the man who had been demon-possessed begged to stay with Jesus. ¹⁹ But Jesus would not let him. Instead, he told him, "Go home to your people, and tell them everything the Lord has done for you and how he had mercy on you."

²⁰ The man left and began to proclaim in the Decapolis everything Jesus had done for him. And everyone was amazed.
