All those from Sheba will come.





John 4:1-9, 28-30, 39-42

Jesus Talks With a Samaritan Woman

- ¹ Jesus found out that the Pharisees had heard he was making and baptizing more disciples than John, ² though it was not Jesus himself who was baptizing but his disciples. ³ So he left Judea and went back again to Galilee.
- ⁴ He had to go through Samaria. ⁵ So he came to a town in Samaria called Sychar, near the piece of land Jacob gave to his son Joseph. ⁶ Jacob's well was there. Then Jesus, being tired from the journey, sat down by the well. It was about the sixth hour.
- ⁷ A woman from Samaria came to draw water. Jesus said to her, "Give me a drink." ⁸ (His disciples had gone into town to buy food.)
- ⁹ The Samaritan woman said to him, "How is it that you, a Jew, ask for a drink from me, a Samaritan woman?" (For Jews do not associate with Samaritans.) ²⁸ Then the woman left her water

jar and went back into town. She said to the people, ²⁹ "Come, see the man who told me everything I ever did. Could this be the Christ?" ³⁰ They left the town and came to him.

Many Samaritans Believe

³⁹ Many Samaritans from that town believed in him because of the woman's testimony: "He told me everything I ever did." ⁴⁰ So when the Samaritans came to him, they asked him to stay with them. And he stayed there two days. ⁴¹ Many more believed because of his message. ⁴² They told the woman, "We no longer believe because of what you said. Now we have heard for ourselves. And we know that this really is the Savior of the world."
